The current federal government has demonstrated a strong commitment to the development and modernization of the Yucatán region in Mexico. This initiative is evident in the increasing number of planned infrastructure and economic projects aimed at boosting local economies and enhancing infrastructure in this important southeastern area.

During her recent visit to the region, President Claudia Sheinbaum toured several towns in Yucatán, emphasizing her administration's focus on regional progress. Notably, she visited the Port of Progreso, where she oversaw the ongoing expansion works aimed at increasing the port's capacity and improving its facilities to accommodate larger vessels.



This expansion is expected to be interconnected with various other projects planned by the current administration, particularly the expansion of the Mayan Train.



UPGRADING OUR EQUIPMENT


A new ambulance has been stationed at Port of Progreso's cruise terminal to improve emergency response services for both passengers and crew. Although ambulance service at the terminal has been a joint effort between the state government and SSA Marine Mexico, a lack of resources had previously prevented the acquisition of a new vehicle. This upgrade demonstrates a commitment to ensuring the safety and health of passengers while they enjoy their cruise experience.



PORT OF PROGRESO IN NUMBERS

By the end of May 2025, Port of Progreso has welcomed 79 cruise ships, for a total of 220,136 passengers visiting Yucatan by cruise ship.

Jointly, the top five tour destinations in Yucatan receive more than 1/3 of the passengers who arrive to the Port of Progreso. From January to May of this year, this represents over 74 thousand passengers!
