

TRAINING PROGRAMS

Modernization Project





ELEVATED VIADUCT

The Progreso bypass will connect the Merida-Progreso highway with Port of Progreso's pier with an elevated viaduct, reducing traffic, traffic jams, accidents, excessive noise, and pollution that can be caused by the 12 thousand vehicles and 1,400 heavy cargo containers that transit through it each month. In addition, it will allow for the creation of green areas and public spaces, such as bikeways and parks.

As an overpass across the city, this new construction will shorten the time buses and similar take to traverse the Port of Progreso en route to other nearby touristic destinations while making the town safer for tourists who choose to walk it by cutting traffic substantially. Construction is to start in March 2023. It is expected to last approximately 15 months, supervised by the Yucatan Government and the local authorities, and it will represent a 70 Million dollar investment by the private sector.

FIRST ARRIVALS TO YUCATAN Norwegian Prima first arrival

On October 29th, Port of Progreso received the Norwegian Prima for the first time, while in a promotional voyage. The Yucatan Tourism Board and other local authorities welcomed it and its crew with a ceremony where gifts and commemorative plaques were exchanged. It is an honor to have this New Generation cruise ship arrivals to the port.




Disney Magic first arrival



On November 22th, Port of Progreso received the Disney Magic for the first time. The Yucatan Tourism Board's Secretary and other local authorities welcomed it and its crew with a similar exchange of conmemorative plaques and gifts in an official ceremony. The Disney Magic has scheduled 2 additional arrivals this year (on December 16th and 20th) and 4 more arrivals for next year (to arrive on January 25th, February 15th, March 30th and April 4th).

From January to November 2022, Port of Progreso welcomed 154,037 passengers in 72 arrivals, as shown:
